

COLUMN III ..contains the Old Testament references. You may discover that a New Testament allusion may have more than one suggested Old Testament passage in mind.. list what seems most comprehensive to you.

COLUMN IV...a brief note identifying the item listed

COLUMN V...How the item is used...

Use our four subpoints from page 5 and the "quoted material" chart and add such others as your study may indicate are needed.

Without making a big issue of it...see if you notice any appreciable difference in the quotations and allusions.

COLUMN VI...The nature of the language. Use the same terms and columns as on page 5.

COLUMN VII...Comments or thoughts..

You may want to list any of these in deeper notation on a separate page.

You will each do a portion of the New Testament and I will put them all together at the end of the study (another reason why your work must be neat and legible) so that each student will have a complete chart of the whole New Testament. The work will be due completed on January 30.
