

f. Some summary thoughts:

--note how worship is associated with these things and the various aspects of the services

--and observe that there was no "going through with the motions" that satisfied the requirement of God..the heart of the matter was certainly as important as the mechanics in the process...

3. Specified occasions for worship:

a. the "new moon"

So far as I can tell the specifications for worship on this occasion were not given (in the law) but the observation of a feast and worship practice (including a Sabbatical celebration) is something clearly seen in the Old Testament... simply by looking up references to "new moon" and seeing what was done there. No doubt the agronomic nature of Israel's economic life was vitally related to this.
