## V. The Components of Worship

- A. The Question is the matter of what are the parts of worship, if we may speak of it in that way. In our modern liturgies (service orders if you arenon-liturgical) we have a number of ingredients and for many of these are able to find an Old Testament background or at least an application. We will look for some of these by analyzing some Old Testament passages in connexion with our study.
- B. Analysis of 1 Chronicles 15, 16 and 2 Samuel 22. We regard these these as historically sound accounts of worship practice in formal occasions and the aspects of worship shown in them should also be seen in the more private as well as the sacrificial occasions.
