-stress the importance God places upon it -emphasize the "natural" thrust that shoul be ours -present the character of the Deity -minimize distractions and/or rival idealogies

## VII. Old Testament Contributions to New Testament worship

- A. Noticing the essential differences:
  - The focus is essentially the same but the projection is different in that the redemptive program is completed in Jesus and so a different perspective is offered.
  - 2. The paraphernalia is radically altered
  - 3. The character of priesthood is broadened
  - 4. The Scriptural patterns are re-phrased:
    - a. John 4
    - b. Hebrews 9:1-14
    - c. Hebrews 10
    - d. Hebrews 13:10-16

and to these might be added many other passages in the same general areas.

- B. The contributed realities:
  - 1. The importance of the heart
  - 2. The subject of worship
  - 3. The parameters
  - 4. The emotional realization
  - 5. The particular expressions
  - 6. The importance
- C. Conclusion: The worship practices of our day have their roots in the revelation of the Old Testament and find the nature of expression to be that of the saints of old.
