In summary..it is likely the Pentateuch was originally one work, continuous, and the length of the document and the general content made it to be divided by necessity..although, of course, it is impossible to prove this. It is absolutely fundamental to the rest of Scripture. Moses is regarded as the author throughout the Bible and this assignment is made in the Pentateuch itself (Dt. 31:9, Ex. 17:14, Num 33:2, etc.) The term "Pentateuch" indicates "five tools" and it is known as the <u>Torah</u>...the law.. hence our title the "Law of God." I will try, at this point, to offer an interesting observation on the terms "law" and "gospel". If I seem to have forgotten it, will someone please remind me.
