

OBJECTIVES OF THE COURSE

1. To inform the student of the general content, arrangement, and development of the Old Testament Scriptures.
2. To enable the student to have an understanding of the main themes of the Old Testament..both in expression and development.
3. To guide the student in an analysis of the individual Old Testament books.
4. To aid the student in having a fuller understanding of the Old Testament insitutions: i.e., priesthood, kingship, etc.
5. To help the student see how the Old Testament and New Testament outline the redemptive program of God's grace.

METHODS EMPLOYED TOWARD THE SECURING OF THE COURSE OBJECTIVES:

1. The text of Irving Jensen: OLD TESTAMENT SURVEY is required class reading.
2. All students are required to read the Old Testament in entirety during the course. Significant portions may be assigned for more intense reading.
3. Key portions of the Old TEstament are assigned for memory.
4. Eash student will be assigned a portion of the Old Testament for closer study...the inductive method of Bible study will be recommended.
5. Class lectures will supply the basic material for themes and development of ideas as well as providing the historical data for the study of the institutions. A syllabus is used to supplement this end.

MEANS TO DETERMINE FULFILLMENT OF OBJECTIVES:

1. Quizzes on memory and reading assignments will be held at set intervals.
2. Class participation is required in discussion of assigned portions of the Old Testament and the class text.
3. Student work on assigned portions is analyzed and graded
4. Three major examinations on the Content of the Old Testament, as well as the material presented in class, will be used to determine student comprehension.
