-a..a Here is the intensive use of the relative following the reflexive relative which begins the verse. The implication is for positive identification: "The one whom himself I have sent to you--this very one...." The thought is completed by a metaphor enlarging on that which the Apostle has presented in verse 9. "This one is my very own being."

-b..b The action which is occurring is viewed as practically finished. The writer is placing himself in the position of the reader to show the completion of an act which has not yet taken place. This is a use of the aorist like the epistolary use although it does not satisfy that purpose here

Resultant Reading:

....whom I have sent to you, this very one who is as the depths of me....
