III. Conclusion: We thank God for His grace and the fellowship of believers and trust to realize the blessing this provides as we participate in worship and witness.

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6. BRISTOL (sometime) THE FOUNDATIONS OF BIBLICAL LIVING

An Introductory Note: I apologize for not having exact dates for these although that probably bothers me more than anyone else. I think the other speaker was John Phillips but I am not sure of that. I usually took notes on the other speaker's ministry and kept them, too, but sometimes they got lost in the shuffle of my files and sometimes I did not take them well enough. Anyway....in this series of talks I was concerned about the basis for our daily living and in my introductory remarks at the conference I said there were many books and articles that told us how to die but not nearly enough that told us how to live. Maybe that is less true today although today so many of the books that tell us how to live are experience ordered rather than Bible ordered that I don't think there is much overall improvement. I also know the subject is too big for one short series (or even a great long one) but I tried to select certain truths that I thought were foundational and worked from them. The ambitious title just shows you what an uncontrolled ego will do!
