With a view to what is right and an understanding of what God has promised, we put ourselves before Him as supplicants.

C. What may we expect?

From Psalm 62 we are able to glean some ideas and I summarize them like this: God will act in wisdom intelligence, and power. The problem will not be everlasting but God's provision must be taken of we will just have to "sweat it out" to our chagrin. We will be cared for no matter what but the relaxation that care brings is somewhat dependent on our readiness to trust.

III. Conclusion: In a time of crisis, spiritual living becomes a matter of putting all things before the Lord. At time it seems we must wait an eternity for His decision but there are other times when He answers swiftly and powerfully. At any rate, when all things are submitted to Him....we will understand in a definitive way what the psalmist means when he says "in God is my salvation and glory: the rockof my strength, and my refuge, is in God."

MESSAGE # 3: BRING LIFE IN CONFORMITY WITH THE WILL OF GOD.

Biblical passage: Psalm 62, Numbers 25

I. Introducing the Study:

If one looks through the core of any Bible-preacher's preaching over a long period of time one will certainly see the will of God mentioned very often. Looking over my Skylands notes, I am not surprise at how often the subject comes us. The Gospel, of course, is the basic message, but after we have come into the family of God, the will of our Lord becomes an increasingly important theme. I have noted several times that there is a general will of God that applies evenly to all of His people, and then there are specific aspects in the will of God that are directed individually as the Lord allows. In the case of this message, both aspects are involved and probably one is no more important than the other although the fact is that if one is not in agreement with the general will, one is not likely to know much about
