--The High priest we have is superior to Aaron and the Levitical Order in His person, position, and work. This may become a little tedious but the emphasis of the book of Hebrews is built on it. There is no good in turning to any other source than the Lord Jesus.

(3) Phase 3...Hebrews 8

8:1-13

In this section the emphasis is on the place of Christ at the throne of God and the administration of truth that is His.

--He is a perfect mediator

--set on the right hand of God 8:1

--a minister of the heavenly setting 8:2

-- offering a perfect gift 8:3-4 (9:14)

-- and granting a better covenant 8:6

--Giving a new covenant of the heart 8:8

-- superior to the former covenant 8:13

--resulting in blessings of life 8:12

(4) Summary:

The argument begins with the need of priests, the reality of their service, the role of men in that position and the appointment of Christ in perfection after a spirit-directed line.
