that you adhere to the normal principles of Exegesis as discussed in Stuart: <u>Old Testament Exegesis</u> and the work in our class of Hebrew exegesis. Be certain that your translation work is also thorough and there are no "loose ends" of forms with which you are not familiar.

1. Study of Ecclesiastes 2:12-26

(Be sure to understand the context)

Following our study of this portion we will take a short • excursus on the role/significance of death in Ecclesiastes. Some of my outlined notes are on page 17.

Student report: An analysis of the words for fool, folly, etc.

2. Study of Ecclesiastes 3

Following this study we will take a short excursus on some of the other poems in Ecclesiastes. My notes in brief are on pages 18 and 19.

Student report: Detailed study of 3:14 and its theological implications and contributions.

3. Study of Ecclesiastes 5

Student report: The propriety and governance of vows.

4. Study of Ecclesiastes 9

Following this study we will take a very few moments and look at some difficult texts not treated in our study. A list of these is found on page 20 and we may not get them all in but we will look hard at some.

Student report: Detailed study of 9:10 with theological implications and contributions.
