### I. The Resurrection Promise:

## **II. The Resurrection Presentation:**

Jesus presented a resurrection life model

Scripture: John 20, 21, Acts 1

- A. He showed himself alive by many infallible proofs. His living constituted an example of what the lives of His own should be. As He led them in the first advent, so He continued to lead them in this "in between" time.
- B. The particular steps in this life included the following:
  - 1. Victory: 1 Corinthians 15:57
  - 2. Assurance: John 20
  - 3. Ministry: John 21
  - 4. Fulfillment: Acts 1

### **III. The Resurrection Power:**

Jesus is the source of new life—life eternal

Scripture: Acts 1:1-8, 1 Corinthians 15:1-9, John 11:25-26

A The resurrection power is based on reality

5. The witnesses

B The resurrection power is seen in the new life of the witnesses

C. The resurrection power is known in the hearts of all those who will believe  
John 10:27-28

### **IV. A Concluding Note:**

**The resurrection is not intended to be a mere academic discussion. It is a challenge to believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and to receive the new life He has the power to give. It is nice to study the subject but it is eternally necessary to believe it! All the power possible is lost if it is not accepted and utilized.**

The Reality

Jesus: the source of life: The promise of overcoming death: the promise of resurrection.  
Hebrews 2:14-18, John 10:11-18, John 2:19

1. The long struggle and the last enemy.
- human attempts to overcome

  - the basic facts...
  - it is appointed
  - but after this....
  - and in another sphere Jn 5:28-29
- There is a remarkable hope: Job, world, etc.

Job & Psalms

(32) Jesus = the Promise of resurrection.  
- a small (maybe) but important distinction: resurrection & eternal life

2. God is the source of life = light
- Creator: general, specific
  - Sustainer: John 1

in summary: sin ~~produces~~ results in death and loss of life. We are powerless in this war. But we have One who will take our place in judgment and die in our behalf. The Lord Jesus Christ. Why did He have to die? That our debt might be paid, and to prove the efficacy of His release from the dead to show it (death) had been conquered.
