God is faithful to His word in all aspects

Attempts to force God's will or "hand" do not succeed.
Patient persistence is the greater force in life and energy.
God's government deserves our respect and "cooperation."
There is no aspect of our universe or our lives...toolittle or
too big for God.

4. In summary, Genesis is not a universal history of the human race and not a scientific treatise of all the events on earth. Neither is it mere Jewish history. It is an account of the outworking of God's redemptive program against the background of a world He created. Within that structure is plainly see the failure of man and the eventual localization of God's plan in a people and in a person through whom deliverance should come in broad scale. A majestic book.
